



Licensing requirements: Upon completion of the VN program, students apply for State Board authorization to take the licensing examination. A required live scan for DOJ/FBI screen is part of the application.



Tuition cost and other charges: Contact the school for current tuition cost.

Financial Aid: Xavier College is approved for federal financial aid (FAFSA); and veterans' benefits for eligible veterans and dependents.

Approvals: BPPE; Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (BVNPT); State Veterans Affairs.

National Institutional Accreditation: Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools (ABHES)



Graduates of Xavier College's VN program are eligible to take the licensing examination to become Licensed Vocational Nurses (LVN).

Where do LVNs work? LVNs practice under the guidance of a registered nurse, licensed physician or dentist in various health care settings. Graduates have found employment in various health care settings such as: skilled nursing, sub-acute care, acute care hospitals (inpatient, outpatient clinics and emergency rooms), school districts, pharmaceutical companies, home health care, and assisted living facilities.

Location & Hours of Instruction: The student attends a total of 1537 hours in 11 months (classes 3pm to 10pm; clinical practice 7am to 3:30pm and one evening per week from 3pm to 11:30pm). On the 5th month, students' clinical practice includes Saturdays. Clinical sites are acute care hospitals, long-term care facilities and school district health services in Stockton and Lodi areas.



When do classes start? VN classes start every January and June.

What courses are included in the VN program? Fundamentals of Nursing; Anatomy & Physiology; Nutrition;

Pharmacological Nursing; Human Development; Gerontology Nursing; Mental Health, Nursing; Medical Surgical Nursing; Maternity Nursing; Pediatrics Nursing; Nursing Leadership and Supervision.



Who qualifies? Applicants must be at least 17 years old, and show proof of 12th grade education (high school transcript, GED or HS proficiency).



How do I apply? Complete an application form, and submit with a \$75 non-refundable fee, proof of age and 12th grade (HS) education transcript. Non-US transcripts must be evaluated for US equivalency.

Entrance test: Upon review, the eligible applicant must call to schedule an entrance test. Applicant pays for the cost of each test (maximum of 2 attempts to pass).



What happens after I pass the entrance test? After passing the entrance test, the first 30 applicants who submit the following list of requirements may enroll for the next available class:

1. Official transcripts (HS; college courses if applying for credit)
2. CPR (adult and child) certification.
3. Physical examination and TB test completed no earlier than 90 days prior to start date of program.
4. Proof of health insurance
5. Proof of updated immunizations: mumps, rubella, rubeola(MMR), chicken pox, hepatitis B, influenza, Tdap.
6. Interview with Program Director or designee.
7. Complete enrollment agreement form.

Background screens: Screens for students' background (histories of criminal, drug, and violent sexual offense) must be completed prior to clinical rotations.
